

HIGHLAND HAVEN – THE ESSENTIALS

- Husband and wife owners Gail Riley and Tom Statzell welcomed their first guests to the Highland Haven Creekside Inn on May 17, 1979.
- The inn is located 45 minutes southwest of Denver, just off the main street in downtown Evergreen, Colorado, along 400 feet of the soothing banks of Bear Creek. Pine trees, rock outcroppings and, often, deer, elk, foxes and other wildlife surround the inn.
- The Highland Haven is anchored by the historic Dailey Cabin, believed to be the oldest cabin in Bear Creek Canyon and refurbished in 1996. Breakfast is served daily in the cabin, which also houses catered luncheons, teas, business meetings and receptions.
- Guests can choose from a variety of accommodations. There are four guest rooms, four junior suites, three large suites, and six cottages.
- More than half the rooms feature fireplaces, Jacuzzis and/or hot tubs.
- While offering breakfast daily, the Highland Haven is not your typical bed & breakfast. The accommodations are private and spacious, and the décor is far from fussy. Riley and Statzell personally crafted the inn's elegant yet comfortable style, which they call "Classic Colorado chic," and which appeals equally to men, women and business people.
- Perhaps the most important amenity offered by the Highland Haven is its service. The owners and staff go out of their way to pamper their guests, striving to exceed expectations and honor special requests in a warm, relaxed environment. Guests are also treated to many extra touches, including handwritten welcome notes, thick terrycloth robes and handmade soaps.
